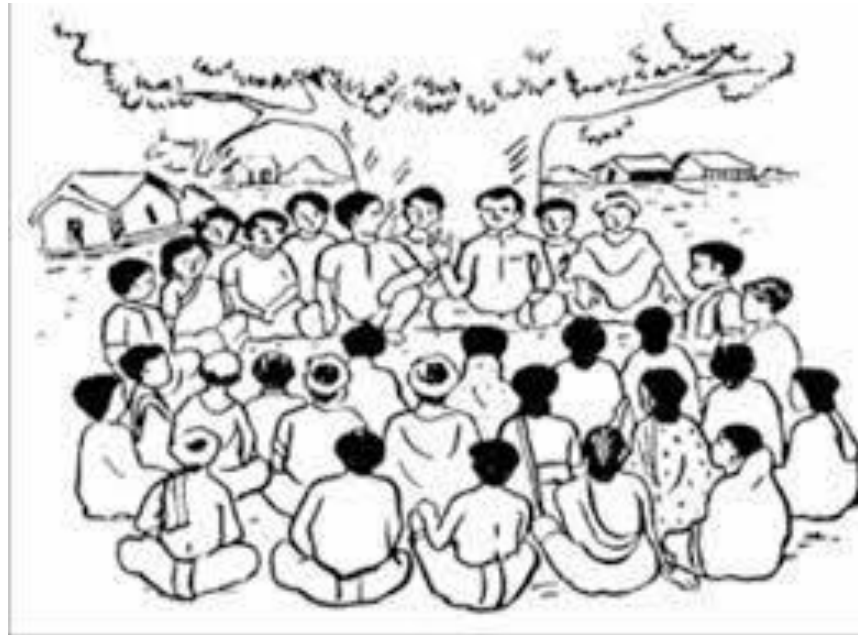

What is Disaster?



Disaster

A serious disruption of the functioning of a community or a society at any scale due to hazardous events interacting with conditions of exposure, vulnerability and capacity, leading to one or more of the following: human, material, economic and environmental losses and impacts.

Why Village Disaster Management Plan is required?

Effective response

- First responder
- Can provide prompt response
- Able to act on its own

Best local knowledge

- Hazards and vulnerabilities
- Indigenous knowledge of coping mechanism
- Hazard perception
- Best assessors of disaster impacts and recovery processes

Development of acceptable plans

- Direct community involvement
- Imbibes a sense of individual responsibility
- Higher levels of community approval
- Confidence in the plans

Awareness

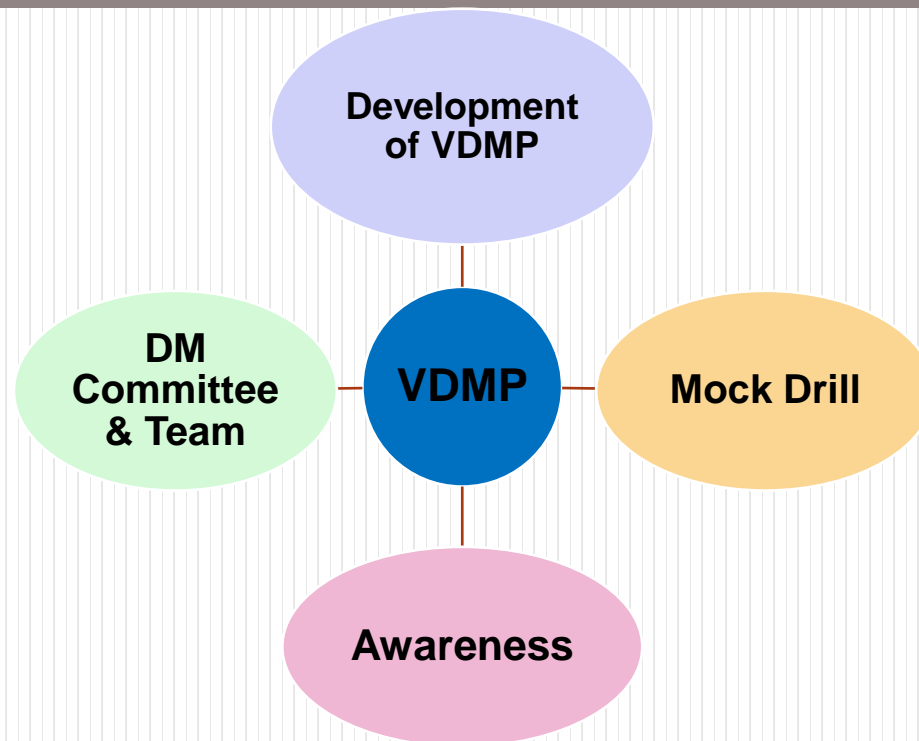
- Risk awareness

The village disaster management plan is a document which details out the past hazard profile of the village and the present vulnerability status on the basis of which we can prepare our future.

- Surrounding of village
- Demography
- Source of livelihood
- Climate
- Critical Establishment
- Assets available in the village
- Existing Risk prone areas and safe areas

1. Hazard Analysis

- Hazard Mapping
- Historical Profile
- Seasonal Calendar

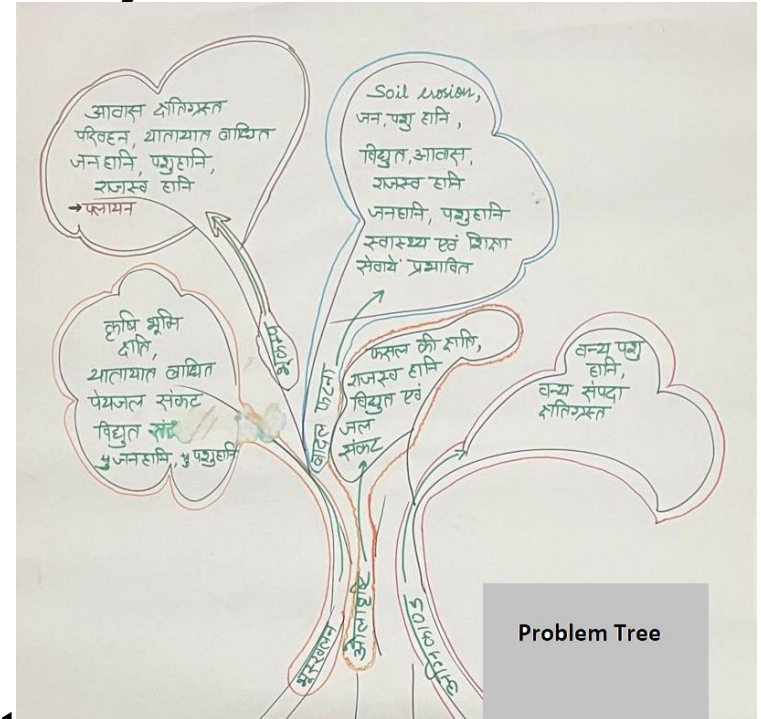


HAZARD MAPPING IN THE VILLAGE
