# Process For Localising SDGs

- Understanding of Socio-Economic status;
- Identification of Issues and Challenges;
- SWOT Analysis is required;
- Identification of Growth Drivers;
- Preparation of GPDP/ BPDP/DP;
- Priorities the development works;
- Identification of Probable Solutions and Strategies;
- Develop the Local Model of Implementation;
- Finally Planning, Implementation, Monitoring and Evaluation.

## Issues and Challenges

- ▶ SDGs based budget formulation;
- ▶ SDGs local level plan formulation;
- ▶ SDGs targets and adoption of C3N model;
- ▶ Monitoring and Evaluation: Understanding of Data Eco-system;

# Role of Data and Monitoring in SDG 2030

- ▶ “Quality, timely and reliable data is required.
- ▶ GIS based Data for monitoring and more transparency
- ▶ Disaggregated quality data is required.
- ▶ Data will ensure that “No one is left behind”.
- ▶ Statistics for Development.
- ▶ SDG Dashboard

# SDG Indicators and Data

- ▶ Limited in number and globally harmonized
- ▶ Allow for high frequency monitoring
- ▶ Simple, single-variable indicators with straightforward policy implications
- ▶ Constructed from well-established data sources
- ▶ Consensus-based
- ▶ Disaggregated
- ▶ Universal
- ▶ Mainly outcome-focused
- ▶ Science-based and forward-looking
- ▶ A proxy for broader issues or conditions



# Indicators and Data

- ▶ Identification of indicators.
- ▶ Indicators are the backbone of the monitoring process.
- ▶ Indicators will also serve as a report card to measure progress for achieving the SDGs.

## Way Forward.....

- ▶ District and block level framework of planning, implementation and monitoring is required.
- ▶ To quantify the performance at the local level particularly at district level.
- ▶ The Index/Ranking gives a better understanding for benchmarking the progress.
- ▶ Involvement of academia and research institutions.
- ▶ Involvement of students for survey and research work.
- ▶ Capacity Building programmes(For Planning and monitoring) at each level;
- ▶ Involvement of CBOs , NGOs and Civil societies

## Contd....

- ▶ The pathways is required to get the quality data eco-system.
- ▶ More scope of academic fraternity particularly the economics and social science with the action research.
